Role purpose: The Cosy Crow Café is a community café run by Gateshead Older People's

Assembly. The café is open to the public and operates on a "pay what you can afford" basis. The aim of the café is to provide healthy, delicious, and affordable meals and snacks and to serve as an active social hub for those living in the surrounding areas. In line with the Assembly's strategic plan, the café also serves

to provide meaningful volunteer opportunities and address the issues of malnutrition and loneliness and social isolation amongst older people living in

Gateshead.

**Key Tasks:** The café cook will be responsible for

 Preparing meals (soups, casseroles, salads, sandwiches, etc.) to serve approximately 30 people.

- Maintaining high standards of cleanliness, hygiene, and presentation in the café and kitchen during opening hours.
- Using all kitchen equipment correctly (training will be provided) and report any damaged or faulty equipment to the Activities and Volunteering Coordinator.
- Complying fully with all health and safety and food hygiene regulations at all times.
